
Through its programmes of free education, social awareness campaigns and vocational training. GYWS has seen many lives changed for the better.

JVM - Jagriti Vidya Mandir

What We Do?

Our school Jagriti Vidya Mandir is a boon for the underprivileged children of gopali village. Since its establishment, there has been several efforts at providing quality education to them with the motto "To educate each and every child for a better tomorrow". With a dedicated faculty, state-of-the-art infrastructure, and a rich curriculum, JVM provides students with an environment that encourages both intellectual growth and personal enrichment.

Navodaya Preparation

IIT students conduct special classes for JVM students of class 5 under JNV initiative to prepare them for JNVST which can get them admitted to Jawahar Navodaya Vidyalaya, the dream school for those students coming from neglected corners of India. JNV provides one of the best quality education to poor children at almost free of cost, with one of the best hostel facilities allowing their all rounder development therefore being quite suitable for our JVM students.



Tuition Management

Since some students may not be able to catch up with what is taught in normal school classes, they need to be paid extra attention. Many of them are also not able to get a good study environment in their homes due to various reasons, so for such students, we started this initiative in which coaching teachers take tuition classes for students during the evening in JVM itself for free of cost and interested students get benefitted by it. We take regular updates about whatever is being taught in the classes. Their curriculum is same as that of school only.

JVM - Jagriti Vidya Mandir

JAM Initiative

The 'Just a Minute' (JAM) initiative was launched with a mission to strengthen the English conversation skills of JVM students. Under this program, we collaborate closely with dedicated teachers, designing engaging activities aimed at improving students' ability to converse fluently and confidently in English. Through interactive sessions and meaningful discussions, we strive to create an environment where young minds can express themselves effectively. The impact of this initiative is evident in the progress we observe in the students' conversational skills.





Teachers' Workshop

To improve teaching pedagogy and Enalish communication, we conduct workshops for teachers in which we introduce new teaching methodologies to the teachers and make them aware of the techniques used by great teachers in the present and in the past which they implement in classrooms.

We conducted demo classes and communication classes to analyse their teaching skills and bring improvements so that students can get maximum benefit from advanced teaching methods.

Special Events

We also conduct many special events and activities example sports day, teachers' day, independence day and children's day etc where children participate in a lot of activities and get exposure to a wide variety of things which helps them in building life skills and sportsmanship leading to overall personality development.

HOSTEL

Hostel Inauguration:

Established on March 6, 2022, our hostel at Jagriti Vidya Mandir serves as a secure haven for our students, providing essential facilities for comfortable living and an ideal study environment. Over the past year, we've remarkable witnessed progress numerous developments that have enhanced the hostel experience.

Accommodations and Beddings:-

hostel currently accommodates Our approximately 45 boys and 20 girls, all diligently cared for by our dedicated team of 4 hostel wardens. To ensure the utmost comfort, we've introduced some significant upgrades, including the installation of pedestal fans for improved ventilation, water purifiers for clean drinking water, and the provision of 46 beds for boys and 30 beds for girls.

Hygiene and Medical Care:

To guarantee the well-being of our students, we maintain a strong focus on hygiene and health. Three dedicated cleaning staff members, one cook, and a security guard ensure that the hostel remains a clean, safe, and orderly space. In addition, we keep a well-stocked inventory of medical supplies in the hostel. Furthermore, our students receive medical check-ups from a visiting doctor once every week who provides care and support to address any health concerns.

Nutrition and Feeding India Initiative:-

To cater to the nutritional needs of our students, we've initiated a partnership with Zomato's Feeding India program. This collaboration generously supplies groceries and nutritious meals four times a day to our hostel students. We recognise that proper

nutrition is essential for their academic and overall well-being.

Student Engagement and Activities:-

Ensuring holistic development is at the core of our hostel's mission. To ensure the hostel students maintain excellent overall health. we conduct many sports events like cricket and badminton tournaments. Students enjoy a lot while participating in these activities, and it also develops good sportsmanship among them. We also engage them in many cultural activities like drawing competitions, poem recitation and mimicry, which teaches them to collaborate, leading to overall personality development. We also conduct some activities like showing movies on laptops and taking guizzes so the students feel energised.

Aashayein



Aashayein is an annual event organised by GYWS to celebrate the Annual Day of Jagriti Vidya Mandir (JVM), where numerous students showcase their talents via captivating performances. The event was conducted on the grounds of JVM on 26th March 2023, spanning around 3 hours, in which students participated in various cultural activities displaying magnificent performances. The parents of the children were honoured, recognising their valuable support in shaping the students into future

leaders. It provided students with a respite from their usual school routine while equipping them for the approaching academic session.

The event commenced with the ceremonial lighting of the diya, symbolising the beginning of the proceedings. This year's Aashayein event theme was Navras, the nine emotions: Sringaar, Vibhatsa, Hasya, Raudra, Veera, Karuna, Bhavanaka. Shaanta, and Adbhuta.

Navras represent the nine human emotions that we experience in our daily lives. We celebrated Aashayein by embracing these emotions.

Hasya (Laughter): Hasya brings joy and humor to life, fostering positive and cheerful interactions among children and others. Raudra (Anger): While anger is natural, teaching children to manage and express it constructively helps develop emotional intelligence and healthier relationships.

Veera (Courage): Encouraging bravery empowers children to face challenges, stand up for their beliefs, and overcome obstacles.

Bhayanaka (Fear): Supporting children in managing fears helps build emotional strength and resilience.

Shaanta (Tranquility): Instilling calmness and peace in children helps them manage stress and find inner balance and well-being.

The programme started with a dance performance on Saraswati Vandana by the students of class 5th. Then the students performed a skit explaining all nine emotions and their impact on a student's life. The students showcased the nine emotions through captivating dance performances and heartfelt poem

recitations during the event. The dance performances were performed between the skit, elaborating on the nine emotions.

All the event arrangements were solely managed by the members of the society, starting from decoration to transportation, ensuring a smooth experience for all attendees. They collaborated on various aspects of the events, assuming responsibilities such as anchoring, crafting an engaging script for the skit, meticulously arranging costumes, lights, and sound system, and ingeniously preparing all the fascinating props.

Teachers and office staff were offered gifts, and the top student performers in academics and students with the highest attendance were awarded certificates, The event was cherished with unforgettable memories, and the children, along with their parents, returned home with a beautiful smile.


Notebook Donation
