## About Us

Gopali Youth Welfare Society is a registered non-governmental organisation established in the year 2002 with the idea of giving back to the society. Registered under the West Bengal Societies Registration Act of 1961 in 2004, this NGO operates mainly in villages around Gopali near Kharagpur. The organisation has undertaken various activities in backward areas of Kolkata.

With the twin objectives of making the youth and society aware and of ensuring socio-economic welfare for underprivileged and weaker sections of the society, various projects are being successfully run by the society and have proven to be milestones in bringing the change. The society is trying to help women, children and aged people through basic sustainable guidance and management infrastructures. Projects like e-Samadhan, Child Rights protection and rehabilitation and PRAYAS are playing an important role in improving socio-economic grounds. KGP BloodConnect and Aarogya have marked active presence of the organisation in grounds of medical awareness. Initiatives like PRAYAS and Social Cell are playing important role in motivating the youth and providing them the opportunity to work for the society. The major initiative of the society is Jagriti Vidya Mandir (JVM) an english medium school providing free of cost **education** to children from weak financial backgrounds.

The society seeks to fulfil its objectives with the help of its executive body which is composed mainly of students of IIT Kharagpur who are dedicated to the service of needy and deprived under the guidance of professors of IIT Kharagpur. The professors have constantly motivated and encouraged us to achieve our goal. The local members are the pillars of strength of our society. The local support which the society enjoys has seen it prosper and spread its branches and the organisation is now planning to expand its reach by setting up its new chapter in various other cities.

## Vision

Gopali Youth Welfare Society comes forward to people to help them fulfil their dream of living an independent and prosperous life. We strongly believe that India's progress depends in the progress of its weakest links.

We work hard to bring together all the underprivileged sections of society and enable them to establish a sustainable society where everyone will have the potential to dream big as well as have the chances of fulfilling their dreams.

6. Organize health check-up programs for rural community in collaboration with other NGO's and health centers and cooperating in the activities of controlling pulse polio, AIDS and other diseases.
7. Help and assist the aged widows, sick, helpless, and indigent persons to through health care service and other rehabilitation programs.
8. Empower the community through formation and nurturing of self-dependent groups in the communities and capacity development through vocational training.
9. Publish annual report of the society, brochures and maintain research programs in rural areas on social development issues.

## Journey So Far

Since very young age, Mr. Mrinal Kanti Bhanja, founder of Gopali Youth Welfare Society was remarkably enthusiastic to serve the society. It was his vision that has shaped Gopali Youth Welfare Society in the form we see today.



Gopali Youth Welfare Society was founded in 2002 and got registered under the West Bengal Societies Registration Act, 1961 in the year 2004. What started as a vision with a few enthusiastic students willing to bring a change has now flourished into a well recognized organisation today which has changed the way of life of many.

Throughout its journey, GYWS has received support from the professors of IIT Kharagpur, including Prof. Damodar Maity, Prof. Adrijit Goswami, Prof. Sasmita Mahakud, Dr. Sudipta Dutta, Prof. Sudipto Chakrabarty, Prof. D. K. Maiti and Prof. Amit Patra who guided us throughout the journey as the advisory committee. GYWS presently runs under the able guidance of Mr. Mrinal Kanti Bhanja as President.

GYWS has undertaken several initiatives such as KGP BloodConnect, tree plantation drive, e-Samadhan, Prayas, Helping Hands and Jagriti Vidya Mandir. In recognition of its activities, GYWS has received a lot of support from many sources such as various NGOs like Nehru Yuva Kendra, Red Cross, BAM India as well as 3 Bengal Tech Air Squadron NCC. We have also received constant support from students of IIT Kharagpur and the professors here as well as student run organisations within the institute.



The prime initiative of Gopali Youth Welfare Society is Jagriti Vidya Mandir, an English medium primary school situated in the village Tangasol providing free of cost education to around 250 children from financially poor background.

What started as a small venture held in a rented classroom at I.M. High School is now a successful primary school situated on its own 2 acres of land in Salua, consisting of 4 complete units, comprising of 8 classrooms. All of this progress could not have been possible without the help of the IIT students, the professors of IIT Kharagpur in helping with the construction process and TIARA Foundation.



Though JVM remains this society's major initiative, it has conducted many other undertakings and welfare schemes as well. Welfare schemes of GYWS cover a wide range of issues including free education, social awareness campaigns, vocational training, child labour issues, health camps and women empowerment.



The present scenario is quite incredible with a vast number of members, ranging over UG students, PG students, research scholars, alumni and support from professors, individual donors and various industries.

The organisation currently operates in Kharagpur and Kolkata and we hope it will expand to more cities in the future for the betterment of the society.

## IIT Kharagpur Chapter

The IIT Kharagpur Chapter is primarily managed by the IIT Kharagpur members under the guidance of some professors. Many other initiatives are undertaken by the team such as KGP BloodConnect, e-Samadhan, medical camps and various awareness and training workshops.

Promotion of GYWS in various extension programs in colleges throughout India is done by these members. IIT Kharagpur chapter also maintains the website and releases GYWS Annual report and Audit report.





## Jagruti Vidya Mandir



Marking illiteracy as its prime concern, GYWS embarked on an education program in April 2008: Jagruti Vidya Mandir, an English Medium primary school. It's main motto is "To educate each and every child for a better tomorrow". GYWS is focused upon providing quality education aimed at educating the children, imbibing the true ideals of humanity in them and thus enlightening the future generation paving the way to a prosperous tomorrow built on a strong today.

Jagruti Vidya Mandir is an English Medium School which aims to provide quality education to underprivileged children absolutely free of cost. It is located in Tangosol village, 1.5 km from Salua Air Force Station which in turn is 5 km from IIT Kharagpur campus. The school is running in its full-fledged form from 15 April 2008. At present, class up to 5<sup>th</sup> standard are run. Eight full time faculties give their services as tutors. Besides it, IIT Kharagpur students take Laptop sessions on Saturdays for students. BPL (Below Poverty Line) students and dropouts. We provide books, uniform free of cost to the BPL students and at a nominal fee for other students



There are about 200 students enrolled in Jagriti Vidya Mandir from Nursery to Class 5. The school timings are 7 a.m. to 11 a.m. There are 8 teachers, with the teacher in charge being Mr. Ajoy Roi. The school also has 3 Aya and some helpers. After a student completed his class 5 from JVM, he is sent to Hijli High School. The educational expenses of the kids are covered by Gopali Youth Welfare Society.

Earlier the school used to run in rented campus of another school, Gopali I.M. High School from 7 a.m. to 10 a.m. Now, JVM aspires to be a residential full-fledged school for students of BPL families offering variety of courses at +2 level, vocational training and career guidance.

**Activities:** GYWS Kolkata chapter is organizing regular drama workshops on weekly basis. A drama team is being nurtured to come up with an event by themselves in future. A wholehearted participation of local youth encouraged our effort to extend further.



## Computer Training Program

Each year [Gopali Youth Welfare Society](#) conducts a three month Computer Training Program at the village Gopali for people from all age groups. Final test for the same was conducted recently at the Gopali Youth Welfare Society Office. Here are some pictures of the same. ## Udyat

### Teachers' Training

The Post graduates and Research Scholars of GYWS along with some IIT Kharagpur students train teachers to converse in English and improve their ability to teach.

The teachers' training is held adjacent to GYWS Office in the village Gopali.

### Sunday Coaching

The Coaching team of GYWS started with the aim to bridge the gap between school and self education. Some student are not able to grasp the topic properly during the class hours, thus they require special attention. Hence, along with the regular school, JVM students are also taught by the post graduates and research scholars of GYWS along with some IIT Kharagpur students on Sundays.

### Innovate to Teach

The main objective of I2T team is to incorporate changes in the traditional method of teaching at school. The children are taught using models, puzzles, practical experiments and videos so that they can easily have a grip over the topic taught. This objective is now being carried forward by both I2T team and Teacher's Training team.

### Computer Coaching

The students of JVM are taught how to operate computers in this initiative. Coaching is held at GYWS Office. Students have learnt the basics of Computer through this. We plan to extend this initiative for students of other schools too.





## Activity Base Learning

This Activity has been started with the objective of make learning a joyful process and bring gleams in the eyes of children. I2T Team and Teachers Training Team are involved with this activity. Every week, the members meet to make models through which concepts of Science can be illustrate in an interesting manner. Educationist Mr. Arvind Gupta is the motivation behind this idea. ## Child Rights Protection

A successful Workshop cum Awareness program on Child Sexual Abuse was conducted by the Child Rights Protection Team Jagriti Vidya Mandir. There was an overwhelming response from students and their parents. Three sessions of 35 to 40 minutes each was taken where the students from class I to V along with the teachers participated. Two sessions were also conducted for their parents by making them aware of the social evil and how to tackle with the same were discussed, so that children can have a safe society to live in and around.



An animated story based video named "Komal" was screened on child sexual abuse and its message was conveyed to children up to their understanding. Children were made to understand the meaning of Safe and Unsafe touch and how to protect themselves form an unsafe touch. They were made aware of 4 private areas/parts in their body where no one should allow anyone to touch and one should also not touch others, irrespective of whomsoever it maybe. They were taught that if they happen to fall in any kind of unsafe situation they should shout No and run to a safer place towards their parents or teachers and report about the incident without any fear or shame.

A volunteer from an NGO name "Childline" was also present who discussed with the parents about the legal support in case of a child is being sexually abused.

**Activities:** Participants shared their experience in GYWS. Mementos and certificates were distributed to all the members.

### Diwali Celebrations

**Date:** 30/10/2017

**Venue:** Disha Seema Center

**Objective of the event:** To celebrate the day with under privileged kids and orphans. To make them realize they have people who care for them. Happiness is sharing Joy. To spread the light of Diwali who could not enjoy the festivals.

**Activities of the participants:** The third, fourth and fifth year members of Gopali Youth Welfare Society went to Disha Seema Center to celebrate the occasion of Diwali, the festival of light, signifying the victory of light over darkness, knowledge over ignorance, good over evil and hope over despair, with the underprivileged kids. They played games with the kids, sweets were distributed and crackers were burnt.





## KGP Blood Connect

KGP Blood Connect is a social initiative to help those truly in dire need of blood as efficiently as possible.

The principle of this initiative is to create a database of all the willing donors in the vicinity, containing all pertinent details such as age, gender, blood group and any health issues. These donors were expected to give their contact details and be ready to come and donate blood at a short notice. Our hope was that through this method the people within as well as outside the campus would never be in a shortage of blood should they ever need it desperately.

## JVM School Construction

Journey which started in the year 2008 is nearing a milestone. In 2008, GYWS took up the cause of educating underprivileged children in and around village Gopali. Despite the increasing no. of schools in the area, these kids didn't have access to education because all the schools run in nearby areas have very high fee which poor families can hardly bear. So, GYWS decided to provide free primary education to these kids. Thus, Jagriti Vidya Mandir came into existence. With a humble beginning with 34 kids and a single rented room at I.M. High school, today JVM has over 200 students, classes up to 5 and 10 full time faculties.

With every year, Student strength increased and space available at I.M. high school was no longer sufficient. Also, JVM ran in the building of I.M. High school from 7:00 AM – 10:00 AM. Three hour duration is not sufficient to cover syllabus of higher classes. Also, students missed out having due focus on extracurricular activities due to constrained school hours.



To solve these issues, JVM's own campus was planned in 2011. With the generous support of Tiara Foundation, New Delhi, GYWS was able to purchase 2 acre land in village Gopali in 2012. Construction of building commenced in 2013 with donations from IIT Kharagpur students.







Currently 4 units have already been completed (out of which 1 unit was commenced by Prof. Damodar Maity). All units were divided into two rooms. Also, all rooms have been electrified. Fans, Lights have been installed. Water tanks has been constructed. Trees have been cut. Now, since there are 8 classrooms, entire school is run in single shift.

Also, Prof. Damodar Maity of Civil Department, IIT Kharagpur constructed a small house under 'low cost alternative rural housing project' on JVM land. This house is already under use by labours and GYWS night guards at the JVM construction site.

The 3<sup>rd</sup> of the 4 units of JVM has also been painted (2 of these units were painted before start of this session) with combined efforts of GYWS and Spectra. Members of both the societies beautifully sketched and then painted the entire front wall of the newly built unit after 10 hours of effort.

This year, fencing of the school campus was done along with construction of entrance gate.







## Upgradation of School Library

Innovate to Teach & Teachers' Training Teams and School Teachers are involved in enlisting story books which will attract children and results in their reading, listening and speaking skills. Further plan is to conduct storytelling sessions, basic drama performance in the classes and reading such story books in class.

## Future Plans

We seek to take Jagriti Vidya Mandir to beyond its current primary level to complete school cum hostel



catering to the needs of over 500 students. The facility will not only provide education up to 12<sup>th</sup> grade, but will also take responsibility of ensuring that its students settle in their professional or educational lives before they leave.

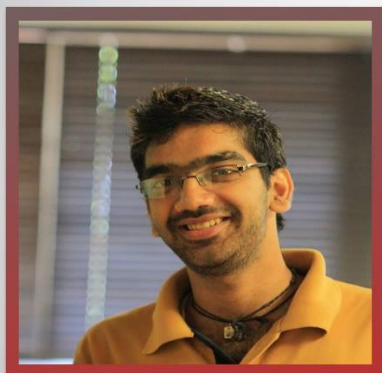

**A CLASS APART**

Agarti White Manish, with 238 underprivileged children, has nine full-time teachers and students of IIT-KGP drop in to take classes.

**GOOD SAMARITANS IIT Kharagpur students are running an English-medium school for the underprivileged**

Some students of IIT Kharagpur (IIT-KGP) have been running a free English-medium school where 238 underprivileged children are studying.

These teachers may be trying to push up their grade point average in order to get a coveted job but they have also found time to offer free education to poor children.

Over 100 students of the institute are actively participating in administering, getting funds and looking after the academics of Agarti White Manish (AWM), an English-medium school in Gopali, a village near the IIT-KGP campus.

This school is part of an endeavour to help run by the students of IIT Kharagpur with guidance from their professors.

The NGO was set up in 2002 by a local named Mr. Ashish Ranjan. "We now have classes from nursery to Class V. There are 238 students out of which 150 are girls. Once they complete their Class V we get them admitted to the local government school - High High School," said Srabati Gole, a second-year B.Tech student of ocean engineering and naval architecture of IIT-KGP responsible for getting sponsorships for the GYWS.

Just setting up and running the school is not enough. Sunday coaching classes and teacher training are undertaken by IIT-KGP post-graduate student members of GYWS. "We take regular classes for the students of JYM on Sundays, and also train the teachers employed in the school to ensure high quality of education," said Sunny Banerji, a PhD student at IIT-KGP's Rankin and Chitra Gupta School of Design and Management.

Started initially in a leased building, the school has since moved to its own permanent campus. The students have also pulled in Rs 4.20 lakh and bought two acres of land in Gopali in 2012. "Our aim is to set up a full-fledged residential school and slowly upgrade it till Class XII. We want to get the school affiliated to CBSE but to do that we need to follow the affiliation guidelines of the board. And two of the mandatory requirements is that the school has to be on two acres of land and have a playground," said Gole.

"We now have enough space to run only eight classes at a time. We are now aiming at expanding the infrastructure and get facilities for all classes. Our nursery section does not have any furniture yet. In future, we would also have hostel so that the school can be a residential one," Gole added.

But where are the students getting so much money? Through GYWS, the students at IIT-KGP have been running Educate a Child (EAC) scheme where interested donors can adopt and fund a child's education, including costs for books, stationary, uniforms, transport etc. for an entire academic year.

"We have 72 donors, who are sponsoring the education of our students for an academic year. These donors include the Alumni of Kharagpur, professors of Kharagpur as well as some industrialists. And the members

and some students of IIT Kharagpur also donate to GYWS. We help through standing instructions," said Gole.

IIT-KGP has not just ensured that the local underprivileged kids get free education in an English medium school but have also rescued 17 child labourers in the area and got them admitted into various schools. "We rescued these kids found working in local industries. The rescued children have been enrolled in nearby government schools and the expenditure of their education is borne by GYWS.

We constantly keep track of their progress in school and maintain contact with the children and their families," said Swathi Vela, a second-year IIT-KGP student of geology and geophysics.

Under GYWS, the students are also providing employment and empowerment to rural women, under which women from Gopali are trained to make paper bags from old newspapers.

These are sold in the market, and the revenue is then given to the women in return. "We collect newspapers from our hostels and residences within the campus and give them to these women to make attractive and trendy paper bags," said Jainwal.

Another popular project run by GYWS is 'SnehaSahay'. "Many villagers do not know how to get their government related work done. Like how to apply for an Aadhaar card, RPL card or a voter ID card. We have a dedicated team to help and guide them on what steps to take to solve their problems. If the problem persists, the team directly approaches the concerned government official and covers their grievance directly," said Banerji.

Also, from time to time, GYWS team conducts awareness health workshops, rallies and camps on maternal health, bird flu and eye checkups.

"Students get enrolled in GYWS. I know when I pass out and get busy with my career, our juniors will be equally passionate about GYWS and one day our school will be fully residential. It will help underprivileged children to study in an English medium school under CBSE for free till class XII," said another student engaged in the project.

# IITians run school to bridge social divide

**Kolkata:** A short ride from the hallowed portals of IIT-Kharagpur, nestled in a grove of eucalyptus trees, is a quaint little school, pulsating with energy and cheer. At first glance, it would seem like just another primary school in this tribal region of West Midnapore. What's unique is that it is run by IIT students.

This is no corporate social responsibility activity — the IITians call it "emotional responsibility".

Students of IIT-Kharagpur started Jagriti Vidya Mandir at Tangasol, about 5km from the institute, in 2008. Even today, reaching this English-medium school is an uphill task — quite literally. Our car lurches and groans up the unmotorable cuccha road. Every day, IITians

take turns to cycle up this same dirt track to pave the future of some 185 underprivileged kids.

The classrooms have been painted in vibrant themes by the IITians themselves, who lug

along their laptops to give computer lessons — and sometimes let the kids go wild with Microsoft Paintbrush. Class are often held in the open air in the beautiful eucalyptus grove. "IIT-Kgp

was founded in 1951 but it remained oblivious to the underdevelopment that surrounds the campus. Some of our seniors realized this and set up Jagriti Vidya Mandir in 2008," said Vibhu Kumar, a geology and geophysics student. "Life within the walls of IIT is comfortable, the world outside is a stark contrast. It is this contrast that motivates us."

Today, the school has moved to a permanent 2-acre campus. The four classrooms and a guard's quarters have been funded from Yogdaan, a donation drive organised by IITians and the Tiara Charitable Foundation. The guard's quarter is, in fact, a low-cost experiment by civil engineering students, who used bamboo instead of steel. The classroom walls have been painted by Spectra, the IIT-Kgp Arts Society. "We even did the land survey ourselves," said physics student Dhammapa Avhad. "The school is our baby. We even arrange for transport (jeeps) to fetch the children, gushed Harshita Chaudhar, one of the 25 IITians who form the school review committee. The 19-year-old from Bihar's S mastipur said: "All my life, have been a bookworm striving to crack IIT. Now I want some these children to grow up a crack IIT."

The school caters to all the needs — food, uniform, book stationary, school bags — though the "educate a child" scheme where donors fund a child's education. Several IIT professors and alumni have. "We follow low CBSC syllabus and intend to apply for affiliation so that the school can be elevated to PL level," said Arbind Kumar, review committee member





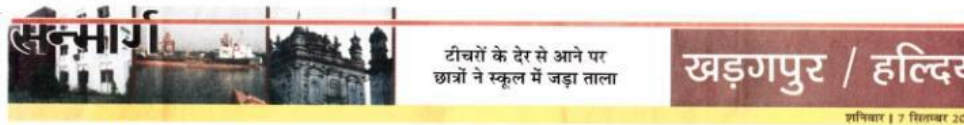

### शिक्षा और स्वास्थ्य की अलख जगा रहे हैं आईआईटी के छात्र

#### फारवर्ड ब्लाक नेता ने दिया पद से इस्तीफा

**मिद्वनपुर :** पंचायत चुनाव में पंचायत मिद्वनपुर जिले में खराब परिणाम होने को देखते हुए पूर्व फारवर्ड ब्लाक के नेता अशोक शर्मा ने अपने पद से इस्तीफा दे दिया। शिक्षा और स्वास्थ्य की अलख जगा रहे हैं आईआईटी के छात्र। पुराने में बताया कि 200 पंचायत वीटो से वे फारवर्ड ब्लाक के वोट 4 सौ 200 पर ही जीत सकते। पंचायत समिति और शिक्षा परिषद की एक मीटिंग फारवर्ड ब्लाक की हितों में नहीं हुई। चुनाव परिणाम को लेकर एक बैठक को सभी विधायक भरोसे पारदर्शिता की शिकायतें भरोसे हुए अपने पद से इस्तीफा दे दिया। पार्टी के जिला अध्यक्ष सुकुमार शर्मा को जिला अध्यक्ष का पद दिया गया है।

**खड़गपुर:** खड़गपुर आईआईटी के छात्र पढ़ाई कर अपना भविष्य बनाने में लगे ही हैं लेकिन उनकी एक ही छात्र गरीब बच्चों के बीच शिक्षा और स्वास्थ्य को अलख जगाने में लगे हैं। वे लोग पिछले 5 वर्षों से आईआईटी से तकनीक युक्त किनोवैटोर पुर गोपाली में एक सीमावर्ती कार्यक्रम अंतर्गत माध्यम का एक क्लब चला रहे हैं, जिसमें गरीब बच्चों को अंग्रेजी माध्यम से शिक्षा प्रदान की जा रही है साथ ही साथ उनके स्वास्थ्य का भी ध्यान रखा जाता है।

खड़गपुर आईआईटी के कुछ छात्रों ने गरीब बच्चों के बीच शिक्षा प्रदान करने के लिए 5 वर्षों पहले गोपाली ग्राम सेवाकार्य समिति नामक एक संस्था बनायी थी, जिसमें और और तकनीक युक्त सी ज्ञान सदन को मिला। उन छात्रों ने गोपाली में बाल शिशु माध्यम सेमिनार शुरू करके माध्यम के परिवार के अंतर जागृति मित्रा मंदिर नामक एक अंग्रेजी स्कूल खोला है। हाल पर वह लोग गोपाली और उनके आसपास के तकरीबन 5 कि.मी. के दूर विश्व छात्रों में रहने वाले गरीब बच्चों को लेकर आगे हैं और उन्हें

निःशुल्क पढ़ाते हैं। वहां पर किनोवैटोर क्लब नामक एक बच्चों को मदद करता है। इस संस्था से जुड़े दो सदस्य कोशल पाठक और शिक्षा मंत्री हैं जो कि खड़गपुर आईआईटी के छात्र हैं उन्होंने बताया कि उन लोगों ने वर्ष 2008 में यह संस्था शुरू की थी। जो

आसपास के गरीब बच्चों को अंग्रेजी माध्यम से पढ़ाया शुरू किया था। उन्होंने पढ़ने के लिए कई शिक्षक और शिक्षकवर हैं। उनके अलावा वे लोग उन बच्चों के स्वास्थ्य का भी ध्यान रखते हैं। इस बारे में जानकारी देते हुए आईआईटी के सेमेनिकल इंजीनियरिंग के

फाइनल वर्ष के छात्र कोशल चक्रवर्ती ने बताया कि बच्चों को पढ़ाने के लिए संस्था की ओर से स्कूल बुकिंगमें किया जाता है उनके स्वास्थ्य निगरानी और कौशल भी दी जाती है। उन्होंने बताया कि उनके साथ-साथ समय-समय पर बच्चों के स्वास्थ्य को परीक्षा भी बनायी

जाती है तथा वर्ष में एक बार आईआईटी में रहने वाले लोगों से पुराने अखबारों को लेकर वहां के गोपाली की कुछ महिलाओं को दिया जाता है जिससे वह महिलाएं लेना बनाती हैं। कोशल के अनुसार इस कार्य से महिलाओं को आर्थिक स्थिति में सुधार तो होता ही है उसके अलावा उन लोगों को चेकने के बाद संस्था को आर्थिक लाभ मिलता है जो बच्चों को पढ़ाने के काम में आता है। उन्होंने बताया कि किनोवैटोर उनकी संस्था में 240 बच्चे पढ़ रहे हैं। इसके अलावा उनके लिए एक बड़ा क्लब बनने का काम भी चल रहा है जो गोपाली के समीप ही बनाया जा रहा है। इस कार्य में खड़गपुर आईआईटी के कुछ अध्यापक भी उनका साथ दे रहे हैं, जिससे छात्रों को और भी उत्साह मिलता है। जागृति मित्रा मंदिर में पढ़ने वाले शिक्षकों ने बताया कि वहां पर पढ़ने आने वाले बच्चों में काफी प्रतिक्रिया है लेकिन परिवार को आर्थिक परिस्थिति के कारण होने के कारण पढ़ाने नहीं आ रही है लेकिन अब बच्चों को पढ़ाने को मिल रहा है और बच्चों को बचपन से पढ़ाई करने के लिए आते हैं।

# बुद्धिमान लोगों को हमेशा भौतिकवादी होने की जरूरत नहीं

**पहली कहानी :** नवी मुंबई की अलीबाई पारदी को कई लोगों ने चेताया कि वे अपनी जमीन एसआईईएस कॉलेज के बच्चों के लिए न दें। क्योंकि हो सकता है, ये लोग जमीन का दुरुपयोग करने लगे। लेकिन अलीबाई ने इस चेतावनी को नजरअंदाज कर दिया। करजत से करीब 18 किलोमीटर की दूरी पर कवाटेवाड़ी गांव में उनकी जमीन है। गांव की आबादी भी ज्यादा नहीं है। यही

कोई 550 मकान हैं। और ज्यादातर लोग डोंगर-कोली आदिवासी समुदाय के। आदिवासियों की जमीन की खरीद-फरोख्त सहज नहीं होती। लेकिन कॉलेज के लोगों ने अलीबाई को यकीन दिलाया कि वे जमीन का दुरुपयोग नहीं करेंगे। अलीबाई भी अपने गांव में विकास चाहती थीं। इसलिए उन्होंने अपनी जमीन देने में कोई झिझक नहीं दिखाई। यह 2013 की बात है। तब से वहां एसआईईएस कॉलेज के बच्चों और शिक्षकों ने गांव वालों की बेहतरी के लिए काम करना शुरू कर दिया। आज हालत ये है कि गांव में 2,000 वर्गफीट का कम्युनिटी हॉल है। ईंटों से बने 32 मकान हैं। तीन टॉयलेट ब्लॉक्स हैं। इनमें 17 टॉयलेट हैं। छह बोरवेल हैं। गांव का कचरा और गोबर वगैरह डम्प करने के लिए कम्पोस्ट पिट है। वहां से जैविक खाद बनती है। पहले एक टूटा-फूटा स्कूल था, जिसकी हालत अब काफी बेहतर की जा चुकी है। यानी पूरा कायाकल्प। कॉलेज के बायोकेमिस्ट्री के स्टूडेंट्स ने यहां ऐसी खाद बनाना शुरू की जो जमीन के लिए मुफीद हो। बॉटनी के स्टूडेंट्स ने ऐसे पौधे लगाए जो पानी कम लेते हों। लेकिन ज्यादा फायदा देते हों। केमिस्ट्री और माइक्रोबायोलॉजी के स्टूडेंट्स ने वाटर ट्रीटमेंट प्लांट लगाया। साथ ही गांव वालों को सिखाया कि कुआं का पानी कैसे साफ रखा जा सकता है। कॉलेज के एनसीसी कैडेट्स ने गांव में नालियां बनाईं। स्कूल के बच्चों ने भी हाथ बढ़ाया। उन्होंने गांव वालों को बेसिक अंग्रेजी पढ़ना-लिखना सिखाया। अब ये बच्चे मिलकर गांव में रेनवाटर हार्वेस्टिंग पर काम कर रहे हैं। अगले साल तक यह तैयार हो जाएगा।

पारदी ने जो सपना देखा था। जिस यकीन से उन्होंने जमीन दान की थी। वह यकीन, वह सपना, साकार हो रहा है। उनका गांव आत्मनिर्भरता और तरक्की की तरफ कदम बढ़ा चुका है। दूसरी कहानी : पश्चिम बंगाल के पश्चिमी मिदनापुर जिले में एक जगह है, तांगासोल। आईआईटी खड़गपुर से यही कोई पांच किलोमीटर की दूरी पर। इस गांव में यूकेलिप्टस के पेड़ों से घिरी खूबसूरत सी जगह पर एक स्कूल है। पक्षियों के साथ यहां बच्चों की चहचहाहट भी बदस्तूर गुंजती रहती है। पहली नजर में यह स्कूल सामान्य सा लगता है। लेकिन वास्तव में यह सामान्य है नहीं। क्योंकि इसे किसी

सरकार या कंपनी ने नहीं खोला है। बल्कि आईआईटी खड़गपुर के बच्चे इसे चला रहे हैं। यानी यह कोई कॉरपोरेट सोशल रिस्पॉन्सिबिलिटी न होकर बड़े बच्चों की छोटे बच्चों के लिए इमोशनल रिस्पॉन्सिबिलिटी है।

आईआईटी खड़गपुर के बच्चों ने 2008 में जागृति विद्या मंदिर शुरू किया था। सच कहें तो इस स्कूल तक पहुंचना आज भी खासा मुश्किल है। पर आईआईटी के स्टूडेंट रोज साइकिल से यहां तक आते हैं। और स्कूल में आने वाले करीब 185र गरीब और बेसहारा बच्चों को पढ़ाते हैं। इंग्लिश मीडियम में। स्कूल की कक्षाओं की दीवारों पर शानदार पेंटिंग नजर आती है। और वह भी आईआईटी के बच्चों ने ही की है। वे छोटे बच्चों को भी पेंटिंग करना और रंगों से खेलना सिखाते हैं। लेकिन दीवारों पर नहीं बल्कि अपने लैपटॉप पर। पेंटब्रश के जरिए। बच्चे भी दीवानों की तरह घंटों उनके कंप्यूटरों से खेलते रहते हैं। आईआईटी के स्टूडेंट्स ने योगदान के नाम से एक फंड कलेक्शन इज्राइ चलाई थी। इसके जरिए जो पैसा मिला उससे इस स्कूल की स्थायी बिल्डिंग बनकर तैयार हो चुकी है। चार क्लासरूम हैं। दो एकड़ जमीन पर स्कूल कैम्पस है। गार्ड रूम अलग से है। इस कवायद में आईआईटी के बच्चों की मदद तियारा चैरिटेबल फाउंडेशन भी कर रहा है। और आईआईटी की ओर से इस अभियान को लीड कर रही हैं, हर्षिता चौधरी। सिर्फ 19 साल की हैं। लेकिन इरादे बड़े। समस्तीपुर, बिहार की रहने वाली हैं। उनके साथ 25 आईआईटीयन्स हैं। इन सबकी इच्छा है कि उनके स्कूल के बच्चे एक दिन आईआईटी ज्वाइन करें।

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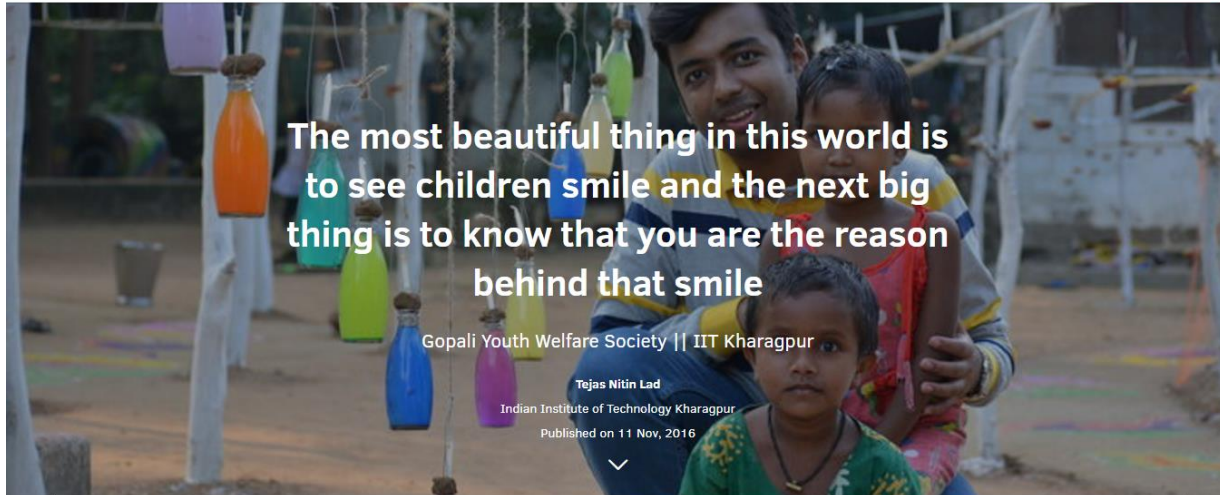

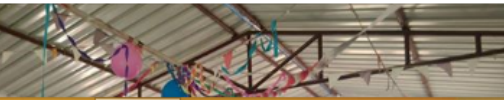
