




#### **ASER** Annual Status of Education Report

This is an annual survey that aims to provide reliable annual estimates of children's schooling status and basic learning levels for each state and rural district in India.

Children in the age group 5-16 are tested in basic reading and arithmetic. Simple tests are conducted in the school itself after which students can be grouped seperately according to their performances and taught accordingly.

The Arithmetic and Reading are progressive tools. For example, the Arithmetic graph for JVM Class 3 students (green coloured) means that there is no one (0%) who cannot recognize numbers (0-9), 35% students can recognize numbers (0-100) but cannot do subtraction, 52% students can do subtraction but not division and 13% can do division. These results are on the basis of the tests conducted in the year 2019.

Smart classes provide children with amusing experiences and make learning more fun and interesting. They also provide alternate teaching methods improving overall teaching standards at the school. This lets students imagine more effectively and creatively. The learning content for smart classes is provided by Bodhaguru, an Ed-Tech company.

Focused on achieving overall development of the child, we conduct one quick daily activity in the school based on Motor Skills, Logic & Intellectual Thinking and Social Emotional Development. This helps the child to learn and adapt to different situations quickly and smartly.

#### ACTIVITY BASED LEARNING

With aim to reform our education system by shifting it towards an organic learning approach and ensuring holistic development of every child, we developed booklets based on activity-based learning methods, to make learning and teaching fun, and ensure overall development of every child.



Extracurricular Activities teach students values and skills for life, be it leadership, confidence and sense of togetherness. Art, craft, dance and sports also bring colours to a child's life. Under these, the stress is on developing life-skills which otherwise are not covered in academic curriculum. They fulfill the overall development of the child building them for the future.

#### TAILORING WORKSHOP


